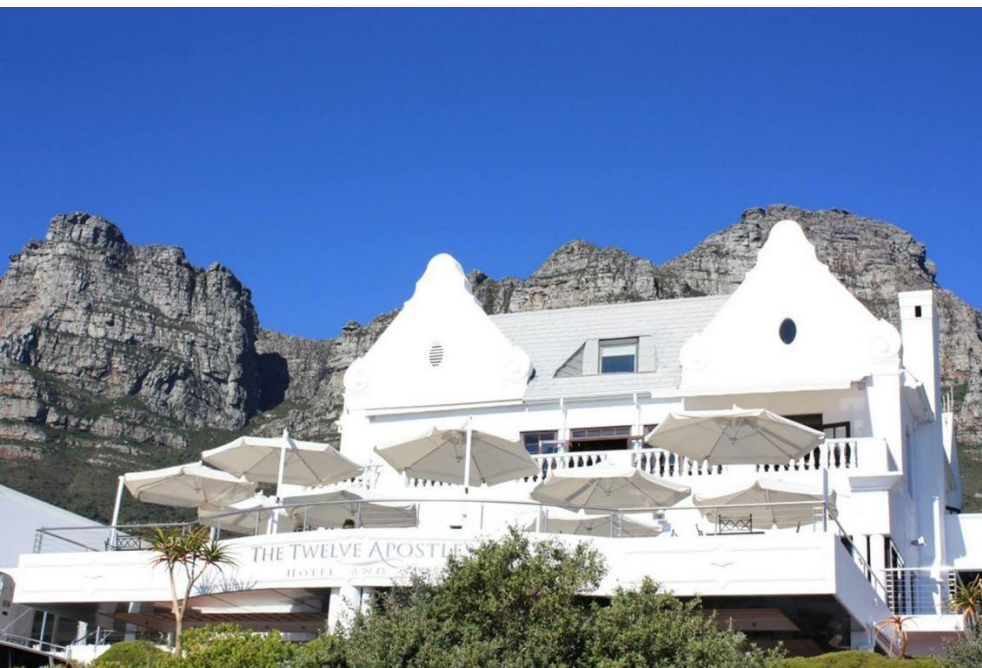

The Twelve Apostles Hotel and Spa is the ideal destination for families travelling to Cape Town, with an array of in-house facilities and services to ensure lifelong memories for young travellers. Cool off in the two hotel swimming pools, picnic in the indigenous gardens, or settle in for a movie in our private cinema. We'll bring popcorn! Children of all ages are welcomed at the hotel, and guests aged 12 and below stay free of charge when sharing with two adults. Children receive a complimentary gift bag on arrival, filled with a welcome gift and a souvenir card to redeem special treats throughout the hotel. Child-sized bathrobes are provided, with cots and playful sleeping 'tents' included at no additional cost. Young guests will love the hotel's two swimming

pools, or can visit our on-site cinema, where child-friendly films are screened each afternoon. The cinema offers five screenings per day, and guests can look forward to plush leather seating, Dolby surround-sound and a selection of complimentary popcorn, snacks and refreshments. For parents hoping to enjoy a private dinner in one of the hotel's acclaimed restaurants, a professional child-minding service can provide experienced babysitters, on request and at additional cost.

Day 1: Arrival

Today we are chauffeur driven from our homes in luxury vehicles to the airport for a flight to Cape Town International Airport.

Upon arrival in Cape Town we take a pit-stop at Utopia Restaurant for lunch.

After lunch we check in at Twelve Apostles Hotel.

We then spend the afternoon at leisure at the hotel to soak in the atmosphere and to get acquainted with the hotel's facilities.

Supper at Café Grill at the hotel.



Day 2: Robben Island and Two Oceans Aquarium

After breakfast our day starts with the tour of Robben Island. We board the Robben Island Ferry for our voyage across the bay to the infamous maximum security prison that once was home to various political prisoners including the late Nelson Mandela. This World Heritage Site and museum is a poignant reminder of the price paid for freedom. Our tour includes a return ferry to the island, a bus tour on the island and an integrated tour of the prison.



After lunch at San Marco's Italian Restaurant, we spend the afternoon at Two Oceans Aquarium, home to more than 10 000 sea animals of all shapes, sizes and colours; including Nemo the clownfish! It's an exciting peek into life off our shores, with a mesmerising swaying kelp forest, schools of shiny fish swimming in unison, gliding turtles and even sharks, which can also be viewed from within a 10-metre glass tunnel. There are more exotic fish too, such as jellies, octopus, seahorses, pufferfish and moray eels. The popular penguin exhibit is always a hit, plus look out for birds, amphibians and invertebrates. Children love this fantastical underwater wonderland that's constantly changing, plus they can get up close to anemones and starfish at the Touch Pool. There are also marine-themed puppet shows and arts and crafts for kids.

Day 3: Table Mountain and Iziko Planetarium



After breakfast we go up the Table Mountain. The Cape's original Khoi inhabitants named the mountain "huri ʒoaxa" (Hoerikwaggo), meaning "Mountain of the Sea". Table Mountain is synonymous with Cape Town and is one of the most iconic mountains on earth. It's one of the New Seven Wonders of the World and, in 1998, Nelson Mandela proclaimed it "a gift to the earth". The sight of Table Mountain has inspired sailors, explorers, travellers, spiritual

healers and tourists throughout the ages. And, since the Cableway opened in 1929, no visit to the Cape is complete without a sightseeing cable-car ride to the top. The mountain's highest point is 1 086 metres above sea level and it's estimated that around 2 200 species of plants are found here, many of which are endemic and found nowhere else in the world.

Lunch at Table Mountain Aerial Café.

After lunch we visit Iziko Planetarium. In a world without iPads, the Planetarium's projected night sky was one of the few things children deemed worthy of their absolute attention. This favourite has undergone a 21st-century makeover with a Digital Dome, making it the most advanced planetarium on the continent, providing both multi-sensory edutainment and cutting-edge scientific research facilities. With its 360-degree screen, it makes virtual voyages of the entire universe possible. The planetarium offers nine shows, three of them specifically for children.

Day 4: Kirstenbosch Botanical Garden



Today after breakfast we head over to the Kirstenbosch Botanical Garden. This 36-hectare garden is a fun outing for the whole family. Pack a picnic, take a tree-top walk along the Boomslang (Tree Canopy Walkway), stop by the Kirstenbosch Tea Room for tea and scones and or milkshakes and waffles for the kids, or swing by the Kirstenbosch Garden Centre to stock up on some indigenous plants for your garden, and the Kirstenbosch Bookshop which has some great reads for kids.

Children love the garden because of the freedom to roam, exploring streams, climbing rocks and enjoying the wide-open space.

Return to the hotel for the afternoon cinema for the kids where they can look forward to plush leather seating, Dolby surround-sound and a selection of complimentary popcorn, snacks and refreshments.

Child minding service from the hotel is arranged for the kids while they are at the movies in the hotel.

After a movie the children will be guided to the restaurant for supper.



While the kids are at the movies and having supper in the company of child minding service, parents enjoy afternoon High Tea which includes sweet and savoury treats, dainty finger sandwiches, chocolate brownies, cream puffs, macarons, madeleines, and more. Of course, there is also the classic teatime treat: scones with jam and freshly whipped cream.

High tea includes a bottomless selection of loose-leaf teas and speciality coffee, or indulge in Moët & Chandon High Tea, served with a glass of Brut Imperial champagne.

Supper is a traditional South African braai at the hotel. The Apostles Braai showcases the very best of the South African barbeque tradition and is built on a foundation of tender, locally sourced meat, flame-grilled fare cooked al fresco on the terrace. The four-course braai menu, created by Executive Chef Christo Pretorius, features biltong, boerewors, rooster brood, droëwors, a selection of family style sharing dishes, and a feast of flavoursome, marinated grilled meats from the braai.



Day 5: Day at Leisure

Today we spend the day at leisure at the hotel with breakfast, lunch and supper.

Young children will love the two pools at The Twelve Apostles Hotel and Spa. The infinity pool overlooking the Atlantic Ocean offers the unique opportunity to spot whales and dolphins from the pool, while the quieter 'rock pools' at the rear of the hotel boast impressive views onto Table Mountain. Older children will also love exploring the gardens of indigenous fynbos. Pool toys are provided.



Other activities which the kids participate in are:

- Pizza or cupcake making
- Milkshake making
- Smoothie making
- Outdoor games in the Fynbos Gardens including croquet; Boules (balls) & Cochonnet (little ball); Sack tosh; Giant Jenga; Pick up sticks; Treasure Hunting

Child minding service is provided for the children throughout the day while parents enjoy adult experiences.



The gardens of The Twelve Apostles Hotel and Spa offer a handful of spectacular picnic sites, with glorious views of the Atlantic Ocean and Table Mountain National Park where talented chefs pack picnic baskets brimming with gourmet delights.

Day 6: Blue Train Park

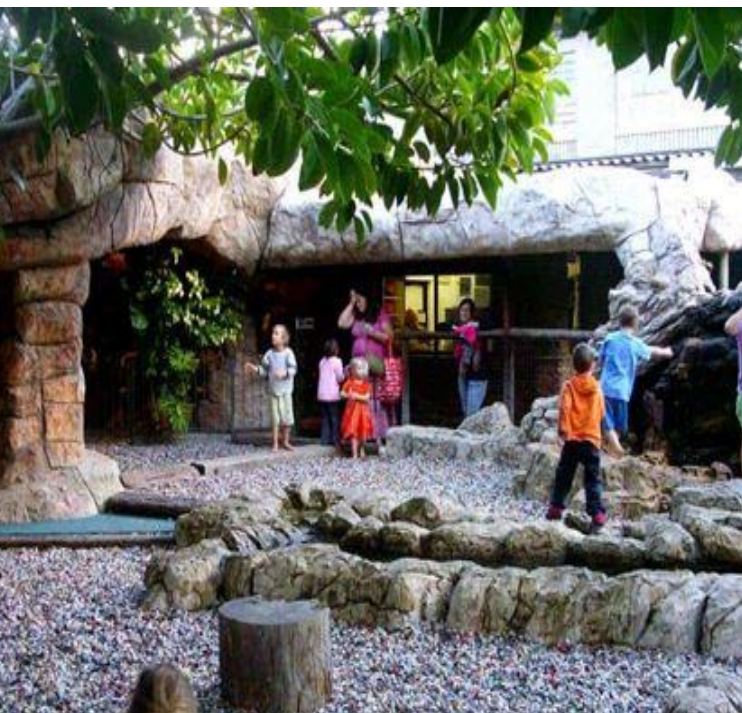


Today after breakfast we visit the Blue Train Park in picturesque Mouille Point, with views of the sea and Signal Hill. The miniature Blue Train has been choo-chooing for more than 65 years. Kids can enjoy two laps around the park, through a tunnel and past the glistening Atlantic Ocean as their imaginations come alive. In addition to the train, the park features a dirt-bike track, a cement push-bike track, a 30-metre zipline, two eight-metre-long slides, seesaws, rock-climbing, two jungle gyms, various obstacles, an astroturf soccer pitch, and a bunch of other wonderful play features. You'll have to drag your little ones away.

Day 7: Science and Gemstones

After breakfast we visit the Cape Town Science Centre where they develop inquiring minds and expose children and adults to positive new experiences. The Science Centre help people cope with a rapidly changing technological environment, and empower children by improving life skills, and also complement the school curriculum and train science multipliers such as teachers, teacher-trainers and parents.



After lunch at Den Anker Restaurant we hop in at Scratch Patch and Mineral World. This is one of the most popular and convenient places to see and buy gemstones and gemstone products. Here we pick our own gemstones and we may never know what we might find.

Return to the hotel for afternoon relaxation and supper.
