8 Days of Magical Farm Stay Living



Few places lead us back to our roots, to our childlike ways of curiously seeking adventures that stem from the ruggedness of nature, quite like the life on a farm does. Where the raw scents of the earth waft through the air from the paddocks, the soothing sounds of the birds, the light landing on the water, bouncing onto the verandah and into our eyes all remind us about the immortality of time. How we've grown to know ourselves on a farm, like the trees and roses and hydrangeas in the gardens have. Making memories and planting them into the soil.

Heymock Farm has a myriad of entertaining spaces, from long verandahs

to the semi-exposed living area known as the hide, the summer gin lounge and accompanying formal lounges to the ample dining space, outdoor braai areas with a pizza oven and fabulous farm-style kitchen.

Day 1: Arrival

Today we are chauffeur driven from our homes in luxury vehicles to Grand Central Rand Airport for charter flight to Howick Airfield.

After lunch at Woodstone Restaurant and Wine Bar, we check in at Heymock Farm.

We spend the afternoon at leisure at the farm to soak in the atmosphere and to get acquainted with the farm's facilities.

Later in the afternoon we have our Welcome Braai Supper at the farm with fully stocked bar.



Day 2: Long Walk to Freedom



Today we wake up to a sunrise hot air balloon experience. Our hot air balloon experience starts with a hot cup of tea/coffee and biscuits as the crew prepare the balloon. We then go up in the air on a one-hour flight and see the world from the perspective of the birds. This is an experience to remember. After landing we are treated to a sparkling wine and full Continental breakfast.

Later, after breakfast we follow the route that Nelson Mandela used leading to his arrest in the Howick area and his imprisonment for 27 years in Robben Island. The Mandela Capture was created as a remembrance to that fateful arrest.



We then visit the Howick Falls, a waterfall which is approximately 95m in height and lies in the Umgeni River. The AmaZulu called the falls "KwaNogqaza" which means a place of the Tall One. Howick Falls are simply breathtaking and the deafening rush of the water from the viewing deck is incredibly relaxing and mystifying at the same time. Several arts and craft stalls are found on the viewing platform with a small coffee shop along the way.

Lunch at Village at Yard 41.

We return to the farm for afternoon relaxation and to refresh for supper at No. 12 Restaurant.

Day 3: Merry Christmas

Breakfast at Village Cafe.

Today is Christmas Day and so we spend the morning at leisure at the farm. Heymok Farm has a myriad of entertaining spaces, from long verandahs to the semi-exposed living area known as The Hide, the Summer Gin Lounge and accompanying formal lounges, to the ample dining space, outdoor braai areas with pizza oven and fabulous farm-style kitchen.

Badminton, boules, giant Jenga and massive pick-up sticks are played across the acres of rolling lawns. Perhaps a bit of clay pigeon shooting or pitch 'n putt onto the chipping green.

Some might like to sit and sip; others might like to zipline from one side of the dam to



another while others might prefer wading in and out of the swimming pool in the courtyard.



Later in the afternoon is an All-White Christmas Party with five course lunch, fully stocked bar and braai supper. Messiah Gumede of Power Experience from Power FM dishes out music and entertainment.

Day 4: Easy Like Sunday Morning



Today is Sunday and we spend the whole day nice and easy at Brahman Hills. Our day at Brahman Hills includes a buffet breakfast, a la carte lunch, afternoon high tea with sweet and savoury treats along with coffee, tea and juice.

Later in the evening we enjoy a private three course supper with wine pairing.

Day 5: Pool Party

Breakfast at Skye Bistro.

After yesterday's festivities we spend the morning at leisure at the farm to recuperate from yesterday's party effects.



Then later in the afternoon its time for a Pool Party with braai lunch and supper and fully stocked bar.

Day 6: Adrenalin Laced Adventure



This morning, after breakfast at Treatery at Yard 41, we head out to Karkloof Canopy Tours for some adrenaline laced escape to nature. After a short briefing and a 4x4 excursion, we start our adventure at the top of Karkloof Valley. Here we enjoy ziplining across the slides with twelve platforms.

As you zip keep an eye for the many birds, mammals and natural attractions, including a 200m waterfall found with this gorgeous reserve.

Lunch at Home Slice Cafe.

After lunch we visit Epic Karting Midlands for some adrenaline-charged experience and race against each other to ensure bragging rights for winning each event.

Supper and afternoon relaxation at Nottingham Road Hotel Restaurant & Pub.

Day 7: Valley of 1000 Hills

Breakfast at Skye Bistro at Hartford House.

Today we head out to Valley of 1000 Hills named after the many hills, cliffs and valleys that rise from the banks of Umgeni River and it flows from the distant Drakensberg Mountains to the Indian Ocean. The diverse area combines the ancient, indigenous culture of the AmaZulu, who have made this valley their home for centuries and still to this day creature comforts one would expect from a holiday destination.

In order to experience the valley in its entirety one would have to spend a few days in the area, but because we are pressed for time, we only select a few attractions.



We start the day at Valley of 1000 Hills at Fig Tree Farm. The farm isn't just a picturesque place, it's a space where we can explore play and relax. The farm offers a variety of activities for thrill seekers, nature lovers or someone in need of a little pampering. Here we are at liberty to explore and engage in activities of our choice (own account).

In the afternoon we visit Phezulu Safari Park where we have lunch at Nguni Café. Before going on a Segway Tour of the park to view the wildlife. The park has a shop where you'll find clothing, and almost every African artifact imaginable.
